## Night of superstars ahead for annual DBA awards ceremony

El-Amin said when planning the event, the board just tries to keep it fun, avoiding a keynote address and keeping it more casual.

"This is definitely not a stuffy awards party," she said citing some of the unique entertainment offered each year, which is always kept as a surprise. "It's a lot of laughing if nothing else."

El-Amin promised this year's entertainment will be just as fun and attendees will have the opportunity to learn about some of the exciting developments in downtown, including the increase in attendance at Fridays in the Park and the downtown farmer's market. Another highlight in the development of downtown is the net gain of 194 jobs and eight businesses, she said.

"The last time we had an increase like that was a few years ago so that's definitely something we're very proud of," she said.

Peter Fronk, chairman of the DBA board of directors, said it was important to host the awards and recognize individuals' efforts.

"It's obvious to us that you want to recognize efforts where it's due and efforts that have been made by individuals and by businesses who help make the downtown a destination," Fronk said. "People are putting on a new coat of paint, they're replacing windows, they're sweeping off their steps and putting forth that extra effort."

Fronk said the awards are a great way to showcase all the ways the DBA is involved in downtown and the ways people can get involved in improving the downtown.

"Maybe they'll be interested in volunteering, or making a float for the parade, or they're an artist and they'll say, 'hey they have an Art Walk' and get involved," he said. "It doesn't have to be every event... but they can get involved no matter how small or large."
